

Pin Cushion Jar



Supplies:

- Hot glue gun
- Fabric of choice
- Big Shot with Large Scalloped Circle Die
- Ribbon of choice
- Lace trim
- Poly- fill (pillow stuffing) or cotton balls
- Canning Jar



Step 1.

If your canning jar has the pop out center and screw on ring, like the one show in the picture, using your hot glue gun, glue the center to the ring...If you were able to purchase jars that have “regular “ screw on tops proceed to Step 2.



Step 2.

Run your Fabric through the Big Shot using the Large Scalloped Circle Die

Step 3.

Working in ½ inch sections, place a small amount of hot glue on the side of the lid and place your first scallop along the edge, careful not go over the tiny lip.





TIP- I like to the glue in the middle and then put the scallop in the glue and smoosh it down to the edge.

Step 4.

Once your first scallop is in place, work your way around lid gathering the scallops on your fabric using s smooshing, or sliding the fabric through the glue...be careful not to use too much hit glue...it will become very bumpy and you can easily burn your fingers...Stop when you are 3/4th around the lid of the jar.

Step 5.

Now with the little opening you have left, go ahead and stuff you poly-fill/cotton balls into the top. Fill it close to being so full that you almost can't close the hole. While stuffing, smooth around the filling with your finger to make sure you have it evenly spread out.



Step 6.

With your hot glue close the pocket just like you did in Step 4.

Step 7.

Now you are going to glue on your ribbon. Working in small sections again carefully wrap the ribbon around the lid, don't pull the ribbon too tight and be sure to line it up with the tiny lip on the bottom of the lid. Also try not to use a lot of glue, it will bleed through.



Step 8.

Take you crochet trim and at the same place that you started with the ribbon wrap gentle around the lid. The crochet trim only needs a tiny dot of glue about every ½ inch.



The basic Jar is now finished...All you need to do now is place an embellishment of your choice over where the crochet trim seams meet...
